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## **QUARTERLY REPORT**

For the quarter ended September 30, 2012

#### FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS For the second quarter ended September 30, 2012 (unaudited)

In the second quarter of 2012-13, the total Payment to Province was \$33.4 million, \$3.4 million lower than the same quarter in the previous year due primarily to decreased revenue performance in the Video Lottery business line.

The Video Lottery business line accounted for \$18.1 million of the Payment to Province, \$4.2 million lower than the previous year. This decrease was due to a reduction in revenue as a result of continuing economic factors and mandatory enrolment of the My-Play System becoming effective April 1, 2012, as per the 2011 Responsible Gaming Strategy.

The Ticket Lottery business line accounted for \$10.1 million of the Payment to Province, \$1.1 million higher than the previous year. This increase was a result of higher Lotto Max revenue due to a greater number of \$50 million plus Maxmillion jackpot rolls compared to the prior year.

Payment to Province from the Halifax casino was \$6.1 million, comparable to the same quarter in the previous year. Payment to Province from the Sydney casino was \$2.3 million, \$0.1 million lower than the previous year.

Win Tax of \$4.0 million was deducted from casino revenues and paid directly to the Province of Nova Scotia during the quarter. This was \$0.3 million lower than the same quarter of the previous year and is a calculation of 20% of casino gaming revenues.

Contributions and expenditures of \$1.6 million were incurred in the second quarter in support of responsible gambling and prevention programming initiatives, and research and treatment of problem gambling. This was \$0.3 million higher than the previous year due to timing of when the initiatives occurred. The allocation of the \$1.6 million is as follows:

#### **OPERATIONAL HIGHLIGHTS** For the second quarter ended September 30, 2012 (unaudited)

Enrolment in the My-Play System became mandatory in Nova Scotia on April 1, 2012. Players continue to have two options for enrolment: light enrolment, which allows players to enrol without providing any personal information; and, full enrolment, which requires personal information but allows players to retrieve their play information even if they lose their My-Play card or forget their password or PIN. With both enrolment options, players have access to play history, have the ability to set personal limits if they choose to do so, and can access information about video lottery play including tips to play responsibly. My-Play has no impact on VLT outcomes, and there is no personal information kept on the system. As of September 30<sup>th</sup>, there have been 6,455 full enrolments in the My-Play System.

Nova Scotians entered nearly 225,000 non-winning Scratch'N Win tickets during the second quarter for a chance of winning a portion of \$0.5 million in prizing that is available in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Chance Program. The second quarter's \$25,000 top prize was won by a player from Dartmouth. Other Nova Scotians also won, including 11 winners of \$1,000 each and 63 winners of \$100 each.

Casino Nova Scotia continued its role as a valuable provincial culture and tourism partner. The Halifax casino was a featured venue for the JazzEast festival, hosting three shows in July. The Sydney casino continued its partnership with the Thunder in the Highlands Cape Breton BikeFest. Centre 200 and the Sydney casino were the primary location for much of the festival's activities including a vendor's village and three nights of free concerts.

The second quarter brought an exciting list of acts to the Halifax casino. Musical acts included Cheap Trick, Cyndi Lauper, Sebastian Bach and Hanson. The Halifax casino also featured the "Waves of Summer" campaign that included special Natal Day weekend entertainment and its summer-long "Lobstermania" food specials at the Trapeze restaurant.

The Responsible Gambling Resource Centres, located at both Casino Nova Scotia properties, received over 700 visitors and distributed more than 2,000 pieces of responsible gambling information materials during the second quarter. In addition, the quarterly Open House event was held on September 1<sup>st</sup>, drawing awareness to the centres and the many tools and resources they offer, and engaging nearly 250 patrons.

The *Support4Sport* Program was introduced by the Nova Scotia Gaming Corporation to help raise funds for amateur sport through the sale of branded ticket lottery products. It is now the most significant source of funding for amateur sport in Nova Scotia. Every time a *Support4Sport* ticket is sold, 100% of the proceeds help Nova Scotians get in the game. In the second quarter, nearly \$0.9 million was raised to help develop community and provincial sporting programs and provide training and development opportunities for athletes, coaches, and officials.
