Schools to receive screens as province exits Keno

October 22, 2009 - As the province prepares to exit Keno, the 180 LCD screens once used in the delivery of the game will now be donated to Nova Scotia schools.

“This is a way for us to provide a benefit to our students,” said Graham Steele, Minister responsible for Part I of the *Gaming Control Act*. “The screens will be used for instructional purposes as part of various educational programs.”

Details of how and where the screens will be distributed will be determined by the Department of Education over the next month.

On September 21, 2009, the province announced it would exit Keno as of today, October 22, 2009.
