Gaming Corporation releases 2009-10 Community Report during RGAW

October 5, 2010 – Halifax: Nova Scotians expect the gaming industry to be managed in a way that balances economic sustainability and social responsibility. As a way to publicly report on its commitments, the Nova Scotia Gaming Corporation (NSGC) today released its 2009-10 Community Report, during Responsible Gambling Awareness Week. The Report provides Nova Scotians with an update in five key areas as outlined in its Social Responsibility Charter.

“Managing the business of gaming in the province is a significant responsibility,” said NSGC’s president and CEO, Marie Mullally. “We must operate in a way that earns and maintains the trust and respect of all citizens and our Social Responsibility Charter guides us in achieving this essential outcome.”

The report outlines over 30 commitments that were made during 2009-10 and includes the status and results of each as it relates to the five pillars established under NSGC’s Charter: Responsible Gambling, Integrity and Security, Citizens and Communities, Corporate Governance, and Stakeholder Relationships.
