



For the quarter ended June 30, 2013



In the first quarter of 2013-14, the total Payment to Province was \$30.9 million, \$2.5 million lower than the same quarter in the previous year due primarily to decreased revenue in the Video Lottery business line.

The Video Lottery business line accounted for \$15.8 million of the Payment to Province, \$2.9 million lower than the previous year. The reduction in revenue is a result of continuing weak economic factors, mandatory enrolment in the My-Play System, as well as reduced revenue from replacement terminals introduced at the end of last fiscal year.

The Ticket Lottery business line accounted for \$11.0 million of the Payment to Province, \$0.2 million lower than the previous year. This decrease was a result of lower Lotto Max revenue in 2013-14 due to fewer \$50 million plus Maxmillion jackpot rolls compared to the prior year.

Payment to Province from the Halifax casino was \$5.1 million, \$0.2 million lower than the same quarter in the previous year. Payment to Province from the Sydney casino was \$2.1 million, \$0.1 million higher than the previous year.

Win Tax of \$3.7 million was deducted from casino revenues and paid directly to the Province of Nova Scotia during the quarter. This was \$0.1 million higher than the same quarter of the previous year and is a calculation based on 20% of casino gaming revenues.

Contributions and expenditures of \$1.5 million were incurred in the first quarter in support of responsible gambling and prevention programming initiatives, and research and treatment of problem gambling. This was \$0.3 million lower than the previous year due to timing of programs. The allocation of the \$1.5 million is as follows:

In the first quarter, the Nova Scotia Provincial Lotteries and Casino Corporation (NSPLCC) through its operator, Casino Nova Scotia (CNS), continued its strong commitment to the Nova Scotia entertainment scene. CNS played host to the opening gala and the all-star show for the Halifax Comedy Festival. CNS also featured many Canadian and Maritime musical acts including David Wilcox, Terri Clark, Tim Chaisson, Thom Swift and The Stanfields.

NSPLCC continued to support the My-Play System by developing updated information material for video lottery retail sites reflecting the fresh look of the newly re-designed My-Play website. The material is focused on communicating to players that the system maintains high privacy standards with their personal information, which has been expressed in focus groups as a primary barrier to enrolment. A retailer engagement program known as the My-Play Support Program was also implemented to encourage retailers in their ongoing support of the system and its goals.

Atlantic Lottery re-launched its successful 2nd Chance Program, which offers players a chance to win a total of \$0.5 million in prizes by entering their non-winning Scratch 'N Win tickets into a draw online. The program will be open for player registration and ticket entry between May 31, 2013 and March 31, 2014.

Also in the first quarter, Atlantic Lottery announced changes to Lotto 6/49 that will offer players new and exciting game features. Starting in September 2013, Lotto 6/49 will include a guaranteed \$1 million prize to be won each draw, jackpots that start at \$5 million, and greater chances of winning with a prize awarded by matching just two of six numbers. Lotto 6/49 will be priced at \$3 per play and will continue to offer players great value at its new price.

On May 2, 2013, the *Support4Culture* program was announced. *Support4Culture* is a new designated lottery program to support arts, culture and heritage in communities across Nova Scotia. It is expected that \$2 million will be raised in its first year, with the program funding to be managed by the Department of Communities, Culture and Heritage.

The *Support4Sport* Program is the most significant source of funding for amateur sport in Nova Scotia with 100% of the proceeds from *Support4Sport* branded tickets going to amateur sport. Over \$0.8 million was raised in the first quarter, which will help develop community and provincial sporting programs and provide training and development opportunities for athletes, coaches, and officials.

In the first quarter, NSPLCC supported three Monte Carlo fundraisers through its *Support4Communities* Casino Nights program and helped raise more than \$45,000. Events were in support of the Lower Sackville Boys and Girls Club, Bedford-Sackville Early Intervention, Clare Special Olympics and the Cape Breton Regional Hospital Foundation.
