QUARTERLY REPORT

For the quarter ended December 31, 2013

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

For the third quarter ended December 31, 2013 (unaudited)

In the third quarter of 2013-14, the total Payment to Province was \$33.4 million, \$1.6 million lower than the same quarter in the previous year due primarily to decreased revenue in the Video Lottery business line.

The Video Lottery business line accounted for \$16.7 million of the Payment to Province, \$2.1 million lower than the previous year. The reduction in revenue is a result of continuing weak economic factors, mandatory enrolment in the My-Play System, as well as reduced revenue from the under-performance of replacement terminals introduced at the end of last fiscal year.

The Ticket Lottery business line accounted for \$13.8 million of the Payment to Province, \$1.3 million higher than the previous year. This increase is due to favourable results in Lotto 6/49 and Proline Sports compared to the previous year.

Payment to Province from the Halifax casino was \$4.7 million, \$0.3 million lower than the same quarter in the previous year. Payment to Province from the Sydney casino was \$1.8 million, \$0.2 million lower than the previous year. This decrease is due to a general revenue decline in both the Halifax and Sydney locations.

Win Tax of \$3.3 million was deducted from casino revenues and paid directly to the Province of Nova Scotia during the quarter. This was \$0.2 million lower than the same quarter of the previous year and is a calculation of 20% of casino gaming revenues.

Contributions and expenditures of \$1.5 million were incurred in the third quarter in support of responsible gambling and prevention programming initiatives, and research and treatment of problem gambling. This was comparable to the previous year. The allocation of the \$1.5 million is as follows:

OPERATIONAL HIGHLIGHTS

For the third quarter ended December 31, 2013 (unaudited)

In the third quarter, Casino Nova Scotia, welcomed Billy Ocean, Loverboy, Hanson, Sons of Maxwell, John Gracie, Matt Mays, Joel Plaskett and others at its Halifax casino, continuing its role in bringing top notch entertainment to the community.

Nova Scotia's 12th annual Responsible Gambling Awareness Week (RGAW) was held from September 29th to October 5th. The week included a province-wide media campaign and street teams that travelled across the province visiting six featured communities (Halifax, Sydney, Antigonish, Truro, Bridgewater, and Wolfville). The street teams interacted with over 13,000 Nova Scotians in these communities, engaging them with interactive responsible gambling quizzes and promotional items. Of the people surveyed, 83% indicated they supported RGAW.

Coinciding with RGAW, the Responsible Gambling Resource Centres, located at both Casino Nova Scotia locations, each held an open house which attracted more than 270 patrons. Additionally, yourbestbet.ca, NSPLCC's responsible gambling website, received 1,930 visits during RGAW, a significant increase over its regular traffic levels.

During its regular draw on December 25th, Lotto 6/49 had additional bonus draws (five in total) of guaranteed prizes of \$1 million each for that date.

Since implementation, the My-Play system has had approximately 7,000 full enrolments and almost 1,700,000 light enrolments, an increase of approximately 500 full and 1,100,000 light enrolments over last year. The high number of light enrolments indicates that players are frequently re-enroling in the system.

The Support4Communities Spotlight on Bingo took place on October 26 in Dartmouth and November 2 in Sydney. These full-day seminars were offered at no-cost to charitable and non-profit organizations to help improve grassroots fundraising efforts. Topics included a session on the recently revised Bingo Regulations, Responsible Gambling Tips for Bingos, and three Case Studies to share success stories of other organizations. More than 92% of attendees gave an excellent or good rating to the helpfulness of the information and 100% of participants agreed that the seminars are an effective way for NSPLCC to assist the charitable sector.

The Support4Sport Program is the most significant source of funding for amateur sport in Nova Scotia with 100% of the proceeds from Support4Sport branded tickets going to support amateur sport. Almost \$0.8 million was raised in the third quarter, which will help develop community and provincial sporting programs and provide training and development opportunities for athletes, coaches, and officials.

The Support4Culture Program, launched on July 2, raised \$0.8 million in the third quarter. The program was established to support artistic, heritage, cultural and community interests across Nova Scotia and is expected to raise \$2.0 million in the current fiscal year.

Also in the third quarter, NSPLCC helped four organizations in Canso, Bridgewater, Yarmouth and Halifax raise more than \$35,000 through the *Support4Communities* Casino Nights program, which provides in-kind support to licensed Monte Carlo fundraisers. Almost \$100,000 has been raised at these events this year, and more than \$700,000 since the program's inception.
