QUARTERLY REPORT

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

For the third quarter ended December 31, 2015 (unaudited)

In the third quarter of 2015-16, the total Payment to Province was \$40.2 million, \$7.9 million higher than the same quarter in the previous year due primarily to an increase in revenue in Ticket and Video Lottery.

The Ticket Lottery business line accounted for \$16.2 million of the Payment to Province, \$3.3 million higher than the previous year. This increase was due primarily to higher revenue in Lotto Max, Lotto 6/49 and their related games TAG and Twist, and Scratch'n Win products.

The Video Lottery business line accounted for \$21.1 million of the Payment to Province, \$5.0 million higher than the previous year. The increase was due to an increase in revenues from the removal of the My-Play system, acceptance of replacement terminals and standardization of payout rates.

Payment to Province from the Halifax casino was \$4.7 million, comparable to the same quarter in the previous year. Payment to Province from the Sydney casino was \$1.8 million, \$0.1 million lower than the previous year.

Win Tax of \$3.4 million was deducted from casino revenues and paid directly to the Province of Nova Scotia during the quarter. This was comparable to the same quarter in the previous year and is a calculation of 20% of casino gaming revenues.

Contributions and expenditures of \$1.5 million were incurred in the third quarter in support of responsible gambling and prevention programming initiatives, research and treatment of problem gambling. This was \$0.1 million lower than the previous year. The allocation of the \$1.5 million is as follows:

OPERATIONAL HIGHLIGHTS

For the third quarter ended December 31, 2015 (unaudited)

During the third quarter, Casino Nova Scotia hosted the first annual Music Hall of Fame gala which included inductees Anne Murray, Rita MacNeil, Portia White, John Allan Cameron and Brookes Diamond Productions. The event, which took place at the Halifax casino, honoured the first inductees into the Casino Nova Scotia Music Hall of Fame with featured performances by Bruce Guthro, Heather Rankin, Dave Gunning and Reeny Smith.

The Halifax casino presented two New Year's Eve shows: Matt Anderson and The Mellotones at the Schooner Showroom and Big Fish at the Harbourfront Lounge while the Sydney casino hosted The Andrew Doyle Band.

The Responsible Gambling Resource Centres, located at both Casino Nova Scotia locations, distributed approximately 990 pieces of responsible gambling information material to casino patrons. The centres saw a slight decrease in visitors in the third quarter.

There were seven Lotto Max \$50+ million plus MAXMILLION draws in the third quarter. An individual from Bedford, Nova Scotia won \$1 million in the December 11th draw and two individuals from Nova Scotia won \$0.5 million and \$0.2 million respectively from the November 6th draw. Two of the Lotto 6/49 guaranteed \$1 million prizes were awarded in Nova Scotia during the third quarter.

The purchase of lottery tickets in Nova Scotia on alc.ca was supported by the launch of a mobile app for Apple devices which has been available for download to all Canadian App Store users since March 31, 2015. The total number of new purchasing players in the third quarter was 10,550, and included 55,700 transactions totaling \$0.5 million in sales.

In the third quarter, the *Support4Communities* program hosted a Spotlight on Bingo seminar which took place on October 17th in Sydney. The seminar was presented by NSPLCC to help community organizations with their fundraising efforts. The program was developed in 2006 and has since offered a number of seminars focusing on various topics which are intended to provide community leaders with learning and networking opportunities.

Support4Sport is the most significant source of funding for amateur sport in Nova Scotia with 100% of the proceeds from Support4Sport designated products in Nova Scotia going to amateur sport. The funding program, managed by Sport Nova Scotia, helps to develop community and provincial sporting programs and provide training and development opportunities for athletes, coaches and officials. The program is on track to provide \$4.1 million in dedicated profits.

The Support4Culture Program is a source of funding for Nova Scotia's artistic, heritage and cultural communities with 100% of proceeds from Support4Culture designated products going to support initiatives sponsored by the program. The program is on track to provide \$2.3 million to help support initiatives such as the Artistic Innovation Program, the Built Heritage Development Fund and the Mi'kmag Cultural Activities Program.
