QUARTERLY REPORT

For the quarter ended March 31, 2015



In the fourth quarter of 2014-15, the total Payment to Province was \$34.1 million, \$4.5 million higher than the same quarter in the previous year due primarily to an increase in revenues in the Video Lottery business.

The Ticket Lottery business line accounted for \$12.2 million of the Payment to Province, \$1.0 million higher than the previous year. This increase is a result of a decrease in expenses compared to the previous year.

The Video Lottery business line accounted for \$20.3 million of the Payment to Province, \$3.4 million higher than the previous year. The increase was due primarily to an increase in revenues from the removal of the My-Play system and acceptance of replacement terminals.

Payment to Province from the Halifax casino was \$3.6 million, \$0.7 million lower than the same quarter in the previous year. This decrease is due to a general revenue decline in the Halifax location. Payment to Province from the Sydney casino was \$1.5 million, \$0.1 million lower than the previous year.

Win Tax of \$2.9 million was deducted from casino revenues and paid directly to the Province of Nova Scotia during the quarter. This was \$0.3 million lower than the same quarter in the previous year and is a calculation of 20% of casino gaming revenues.

Contributions and expenditures of \$1.5 million were incurred in the fourth quarter in support of responsible gambling and prevention programming initiatives, research and treatment of problem gambling. This was \$0.1 million higher than the previous year. The allocation of the \$1.5 million is as follows:

OPERATIONAL HIGHLIGHTS For the fourth quarter ended March 31, 2015 (unaudited)

Casino Nova Scotia featured an all-Canadian line up for its entertainment program. Canadian rockers Tom Cochrane, Colin James and Chilliwack, along with country artists Dallas Smith, Chad Brownlee and Tim Hicks and comedian Shaun Majumder all performed in the Schooner Showroom as Casino Nova Scotia delivered on its reputation as one of the leading music & entertainment destinations in Atlantic Canada.

In the fourth quarter, Atlantic Lottery wrapped up the 2nd Chance Contest which offers players a chance to win a total of \$0.5 million in prizing by entering select non-winning tickets online. The grand prize of \$250,000 and the \$10,000 Fall into Cash prize were both won by players from Nova Scotia.

In March, Atlantic Lottery added eight additional guaranteed \$1 Million Prize bonus draws in Lotto 6/49. Both the March 5th and 8th draw saw an additional four guaranteed prizes of \$1 million awarded for each draw.

The Atlantic Lottery mobile application was approved by Apple for full public release to the App Store and was made available to all Canadian App Store users for download on Monday, March 30th, 2015.

NSPLCC presented Spotlight on Bingo, a *Support4Communities* Fundraising Seminar in the fourth quarter. This seminar was offered March 21st in Dartmouth, at no cost to charitable bingo operators. Over 40 registered attendees signed up for this seminar which featured six sessions on topics such as marketing, promotions, volunteer recruitment and gaming regulations. A highlight this year was the recruitment of Clyde Bock, from the United States, an internationally recognized expert on low-cost bingo promotions.

The Support4Sport Program is the most significant source of funding for amateur sport in Nova Scotia with 100% of the proceeds from Support4Sport designated tickets going to amateur sport. Just over \$0.6 million was raised in the fourth quarter of 2014-15. The funding program, managed by Sport Nova Scotia, helps to develop community and provincial sporting programs and provide training and development opportunities for athletes, coaches and officials.

The *Support4Culture* Program is a source of funding for Nova Scotia's artistic, heritage and cultural communities with 100% of proceeds from *Support4Culture* designated tickets going to support initiatives such as the Artistic Innovation Program, the Built Heritage Development Fund and the Mi'kmag Cultural Activities Program.
