

For the second Quarter Ended September 30, 2019

Operational Highlights

- Nova Scotia had a \$325,000 Scratch'N winner.
- A new ticket lottery game, "Hit or Miss", was launched on September 30th. Eight new Scratch'N Win tickets and six new Digital Instants games were also launched.
- There were six Lotto Max \$50+ million plus MAXMILLION draws.
- One new video lottery game, "Pharaoh's Fortune", was launched, and 90 replacement terminals were rolled out across the province.
- Casino Nova Scotia promotions included the continuation of "Dare to Deal" and the gifting program, and the launch of "Beat the Boss".

Community Highlights

- Support4Sport provided \$1.0 million in dedicated profits for amateur sports in Nova Scotia. The fund helps to develop sport programs for athletes, coaches and officials.
- Support4Culture provided \$1.5 million for initiatives such as Celtic Colours, a celebration of Gaelic culture, arts and heritage in Cape Breton.
- The Responsible Gambling Resource Centres in the casinos distributed approximately 740 pieces of responsible gambling information to patrons, and yourbestbet.ca had over 480 unique visitors.
- NSGC supported seven Monte Carlo nights as part of the Support4Communities Casino Nights program, helping raise more than \$120,000 for organizations in the host communities.



\$36.3 million was paid to the Province in the second quarter.

This is \$1.5 million lower than the same quarter last year, primarily due to lower profits in Ticket Lottery.

Overall, revenue from gaming is lower than the same quarter last year due to decreased ticket lottery sales, primarily in Lotto 6/49 and Breakopen.

Contributions and expenditures for responsible gambling and prevention programming initiatives totaled \$2.1 million.

Proceeds from the sale of designated lottery products fund the *Support4Sport* program. *Support4Sport* is the largest source of funding for amateur sports in the province and has helped raise over \$42 million since it was introduced in 2006.
