- In 2018-19, video lottery and ticket lottery retailers earned \$35.5 million in commissions.



 Direct employment from gaming (as of March 2019) represents approximately \$21.3 million in annual salaries and benefits.



Participation in Gambling

- In 2018-19, 74% of adults in Nova Scotia reported gambling at least once over the last year. Of these individuals, 90% gambled with no risk of developing problems.
- Based on the Canadian Problem Gambling Severity Index, 0.8% of the adult population (about 6,230) in Nova Scotia have problems with their gambling. An additional 1.8% (about 13,664) are considered at moderate-risk of experiencing a problem with gambling. 4.8% of the adult population is in the lowrisk, category.
- In 2018-19, Nova Scotians wagered approximately \$1.4 billion on gambling. During this time, \$1.0 billion was paid out in prizes.¹
