

For the third Quarter Ended December 31, 2019

Operational Highlights

- Nova Scotia had a \$333,000 Lotto Max MAXMILLION winner.
- Ten new Scratch'N Win tickets and eight new Digital Instants games were launched.
- There were seven Lotto Max \$50+ million plus MAXMILLION draws and two Lotto 6/49 jackpots over \$20 million.
- Eight new video lottery games were launched.
- Casino Nova Scotia promotions included a "Festive Buffet" and the continuation of the "Beat the Boss" contest and the gifting program. Entertainment included Roger Hodgson of Supertramp and Platinum Blonde who played the New Year's Eve show.

Community Highlights

- Support4Sport provided \$1.0 million in dedicated profits for amateur sports in Nova Scotia and supported the Nova Scotia Sport Hall of Fame Induction Night, in addition to partnering with Recreation Nova Scotia to support its annual conference.
- Support4Culture provided \$0.4 million for initiatives such as the Association of Nova Scotia Museum's annual conference.
- The 2019 Responsible Gambling Awareness Week included activities aimed at reaching Nova Scotians with important educational messages about responsible gambling.
- NSGC supported four Monte Carlo nights as part of the Support4Communities Casino Nights program, helping to raise more than \$100,000 for organizations in the host communities.



\$39.1 million was paid to the Province in the third quarter.

This is \$1.6 million lower than the same quarter last year, primarily due to lower profits in Ticket Lottery.

Overall, revenue from gaming is higher than the same quarter last year due to increases at both casinos.

Contributions and expenditures for responsible gambling and prevention programming initiatives totalled \$1.5 million.
