We have a shared responsibility to ensure players have a positive experience if they choose to gamble. This means Nova Scotians who play have access to helpful information, tools and resources that encourage positive play through increased gambling literacy and setting of limits.	 Nova Scotians continue to support the promotion of healthy play and responsible gambling in Nova Scotia: Nearly nine in ten say they either completely (60%) or somewhat (27%) support the promotion of healthy play and responsible gambling in Nova Scotia. 83% of the public support Nova Scotia Gaming's commitment to Responsible Gambling initiatives in Nova Scotia. Both the Halifax and Sydney casinos maintained their RG Check Accreditation and exceeded expectations by scoring above the national average. Nova Scotia Gaming's responsible gambling brochures are available in Arabic, English, French, Mandarin and Mi'kmaq. Everyone who works in the gaming industry plays an important role in making sure gambling is fun and responsible, through skills they learn by taking Nova Scotia Gaming's annual training programs. In 2022 the newest peer reviewed Healthy Play Training was launched at Casino Nova Scotia and 100% of staff have completed the training. yourbestbet.ca is a dedicated website for providing the public and players with important information to make informed decisions and help keep fun in the game. It plays a key role in promoting healthy play and supporting the year-round Gambling Literacy Awareness Campaign efforts. In 2022-23 Nova Scotia Gaming completed 1,039 Responsible Gambling Assessments on new initiative prior to their launch.
